DCOH Group Consolidated Turnover for the last 5 years




Figure 1: DCOH's annual turnover has steadily increased over the past 5 years, demonstrating our consistent growth.




Figure 2 Defence Facilities in the Northern Territory

Dual-Nation Strategic Investment

- Australia's 2024 Integrated Investment Program (IIP) allocates \$14-\$18 billion over the next decade to fortify Defence installations across northern Australia.
- Simultaneously, NAVFAC Pacific has accelerated capital works throughout the Indo-Pacific under the U.S. Force Posture Initiatives (USFPI) and Pacific Deterrence Initiative (PDI).
- Australia has emerged as a key focus area, with NAVFAC Pacific delivering significant capital projects at RAAF Bases Darwin and Tindal, and Robertson Barracks.



Prime Contractor for USFPI Flagship Project

DCOH is the Head Contractor for the \$300M+ Robertson Barracks Base Improvements Project, funded under the U.S. Force Posture Initiatives (USFPI). This major infrastructure package covers:

- Package 1: Living-In Accommodation (LIA) Upgrades
- Package 3: Mid-Term Refreshment and Site Services

Our appointment underscores DCOH's capability to lead complex, high-value Defence works within live operational bases meeting both Australian and U.S. expectations for compliance, security, and delivery excellence.

Strategic Positioning for Defence Engagement

DCOH is not only a proven partner to the Australian Department of Defence but also to the United States Navy's NAVFAC Pacific Division. We are actively supporting the delivery of allied-force infrastructure aligned to both the IIP and PDI strategic frameworks.

Our local delivery capability, First Nations engagement outcomes, and robust understanding of live base constraints make us the preferred Territory contractor for multinational Defence collaborations.

Understanding the Strategic Importance of the Northern Territory

The geographic reach and complexity of Defence infrastructure across northern Australia present unique logistical, environmental, and delivery challenges. This is especially relevant in the context of current and future capital investment programs under both Australian and U.S. Defence strategies.

As of June 2025, NAVFAC Pacific is overseeing a significant rise in U.S. Defence infrastructure works in the Indo-Pacific, with Australia emerging as a critical strategic location. This includes high-value construction programs at RAAF Bases Darwin and Tindal, aligned to the long-term presence of U.S. Marine Rotational Forces and allied interoperability objectives.

In this context, capability and capacity must exist locally to:

- Deliver large-scale, complex, and secure infrastructure that meets both Australian and U.S. Defence standards.
- Navigate and overcome the Top End's demanding environmental and geographic conditions.
- Understand the stakeholder priorities, security frameworks, and delivery protocols expected in Defence project environments whether Australian or U.S. led.



Local solutions to local environmental challenges

Being a local Northern Territory contractor, our systems of work are fine tuned to this region's context. Environmentally, the NT has fluctuating levels of humidity and tropical monsoonal weather patterns. If not managed, these variables can play havoc on both the way a project is delivered and effectiveness of final plant and infrastructure over the life of the asset.

Being local, we understand how to plan proactively and adapt reactively to Darwin's ever-changing weather.


Other environmental mitigations that are part of our standard systems of works include:

- Incorporating our deep knowledge and experience in applying cyclonic building standards; particularly in relation to roofing, fencing and other similar building elements.
- Ensuring procured plant and equipment are selected and installed to withstand tropical environments.

- Applying techniques, such vapour barrier treatments, to ensure the final infrastructure is protected from the high humidity environment.
- Staging and planning our works in a manner that works in unison with the seasonal weather to maximise progress onsite.

Given the Northern Territory is relatively isolated, builders need to have an intimate understanding of the local supply networks and resources. 





As part of the early works under the Larrakeyah Defence Precinct Redevelopment Program, DCOH was engaged by Laing O'Rourke to deliver the Enabling Infrastructure for the Temporary Base Entry—a critical precursor to full-scale redevelopment of the precinct. This package was a foundational component of the Department of Defence's \$580M commitment to upgrading Larrakeyah Barracks and adjacent naval infrastructure to meet future force requirements in northern Australia.

Scope of Works Included:

- Complex civil and road upgrades to facilitate new secure base access and realignment of traffic flows
- Construction of the new Nurses Walk Link Road, enabling continuity of movement across the precinct
- Installation and relocation of underground services including communications, power, sewer, and stormwater
- Demolition of existing buildings and infrastructure, carefully staged to ensure zero disruption to live Defence operations
- Comprehensive environmental controls, including sedimentation basins, erosion management, and contaminated material handling

DCOH's Value Contribution:

- Delivered on time and within budget, despite working within a constrained, high-density operational environment
- Demonstrated exemplary Defence compliance, safety performance, and stakeholder coordination under a managing contractor model

The project aimed to upgrade outdated accommodation and support the operational readiness and quality of life for ADF personnel and their families stationed at this strategically critical base.

This large-scale residential development was delivered within the live operational environment of Larrakeyah Barracks, requiring strict compliance with Defence security protocols, site access procedures, and coordination with concurrent infrastructure works.

Scope of Works Included:

- Design and construction of 97 new residences including detached homes and townhouses
- Site-wide civil, headworks and infrastructure works, including internal roads, services, and landscaping
- Demolition of legacy housing stock, undertaken in controlled stages to maintain base operations
- Compliance with Defence Housing Australia (DHA) standards, including energy efficiency and cyclone resilience
- Integration of architectural elements that align with the tropical climate and military amenity requirements



This city-shaping development features over 20,000 m² of floor space and integrates teaching and learning facilities, research centres, public library and event spaces, Indigenous cultural elements, and innovation hubs to support regional knowledge industries.





DCOH is delivering the landmark Northcrest development, a master-planned residential and mixed-use precinct in the heart of the greater Darwin region. Northcrest transforms the former Berrimah Farm site into a vibrant new community for Territorians.

Spanning more than 168 hectares, the project will ultimately deliver over 2,000 new homes, commercial and retail spaces, public parks, education facilities, and essential infrastructure. Northcrest plays a critical role in supporting Darwin's long-term population growth and housing strategy.

- Civil and subdivision works for staged residential land release
- Design and construction of internal roads, utilities, and stormwater infrastructure

Key highlights include Indigenous workforce engagement (12% participation), vocational training spaces, and sustainability initiatives such as solar-ready systems and recycled materials. The expanded scope reinforces the NT Government's commitment to youth justice reform and community wellbeing.






